#### WirelessGeneration

What is the scope/purposeof the contract?

The district is in Year3 of Program Improvement. To implement corrective actions mandated for districts with this designation, the California Department of Educational located funds to address the student academic performance. These funds were to be used to partner with external providers to target the areas of deficiencies. As a result of a Request for Proposa (RFP) process, the District partnered with Wireless Generation to implement intervention supports and assessment designed to determine the degree of impact of such interventions in the areas of reading, in 13 of its most high needs elementary schools and is serving approximately 2400 students. The program supports Common Coreas an intervention and is one of the few on the market that provides "in time" data that can be immediately used to inform instructional decision making and where the reading interventions are generated directly from the assessment data to allow students to be provide with targeted and prescriptive interventions. Similar tools on the market are priced congruently.

(2) What kind of "bang for our buck" are we getting from it? (i.e., we would like a cost benefit analysis from your point of view)

The program is showing the greatest results with students in grades K 2 which is why we have reduced implementation in most sites to this gradelevel (9 of the 13 sites). The exceptions are the four sites where we are implementing Balance Literacy. The four Balance Literacy sites are implementing in grades K 6 and data will be used to inform teacher practice and measure the impact of the program. A high return on investment program.

Students are assessed three times during the year. Base on the assessment data, students are categorized not three categories. 1) intensive (performances far below the established benchmark for the gradelevel), 2) strategic (performances slightly below the established benchmark) and 3) benchmark (performance meets or exceeds the established benchmark) During the 2012 2013 school year, performance from the beginning to middle of year reflected the following progress:

x 17% of kindergartenstudents who were intensive moved to strategic, while 7% moved from intensive to benchmark,
