

Step 2(b)—Multiple Jobs Worksheet (K)



If you are filing a joint return for 2024, you must use Form 4852 to report wages from a former employer if you do not have a Form W-2 from that employer. If you are filing a separate return, you must use Form 4852 to report wages from a former employer if you do not have a Form W-2 from that employer.

Note: If more than one employer paid you wages totaling \$120,000 or more in 2024, you must use Form 4852 to report wages from a former employer if you do not have a Form W-2 from that employer.

1 Two jobs. If you were paid \$10,000 for services performed for one employer and \$20,000 for services performed for another employer, enter the total amount of wages on line 1. If you were paid \$10,000 for services performed for one employer and \$20,000 for services performed for another employer, enter the total amount of wages on line 1. \$

2 Three jobs. If you were paid \$10,000 for services performed for one employer, \$20,000 for services performed for another employer, and \$30,000 for services performed for a third employer, enter the total amount of wages on line 2. \$

a If you were paid \$10,000 for services performed for one employer, \$20,000 for services performed for another employer, and \$30,000 for services performed for a third employer, enter the total amount of wages on line 2a. \$

b A self-employed individual who was paid \$10,000 for services performed for one employer, \$20,000 for services performed for another employer, and \$30,000 for services performed for a third employer, enter the total amount of wages on line 2b. \$

c A self-employed individual who was paid \$10,000 for services performed for one employer, \$20,000 for services performed for another employer, and \$30,000 for services performed for a third employer, enter the total amount of wages on line 2c. \$

3 If you were paid \$10,000 for services performed for one employer, \$20,000 for services performed for another employer, and \$30,000 for services performed for a third employer, enter the total amount of wages on line 3. \$
