


## Implications for Purple Tier

- " Schools not already open to all students for in-person instruction must remain closed
- Schools conducting in-person instruction or supports must maintain mitigation measures, including social distancing, face coverings, and sanitization, in compliance with schools guidance from CDPH and Sacramento County Public Health.

# Learning Hubs and Waiver Applications

{Learning Hubs are allowable under the preexisting CDPH small groups/cohort guidance. Cohorts cannot exceed 16 individuals per cohort or more than 25% of the entire school population.

- {Elementary schools (grades TK-6) may apply for a waiver to conduct inperson instruction. No waiver process exists for middle or high schools.
- {Outdoor only sports conditioning using equipment is allowable for physical education classes and student athletics.

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


## Attachment A Conditions of Readiness for School Re-Opening

Testing available for all staff physically reporting to work at SCPH Free Community Testing Sites during work hours and process to report positive result immediately		Not started
Publish district dashboard on positive cases where individual exposed was physically present at a work/school site		In Progress
Require Face Coverings for <u>all</u> grade levels except in cases where there is a medical exemption (please see Return to Health for criteria)		
Reprogram all units to continuously run with open doors and windows		
Fully open all dampeners to allow for the maximum draw of outside air		
Replace filters with the highest ME-Rated filter units are designed to use		



Disable hand dryers	Not started
Turn off drinking fountains	In Progress
Flush water lines to remove stagnant water and reduce disease risk	Completed
Install 400 stanchions (movie theater belts) to manage crowd flow
