

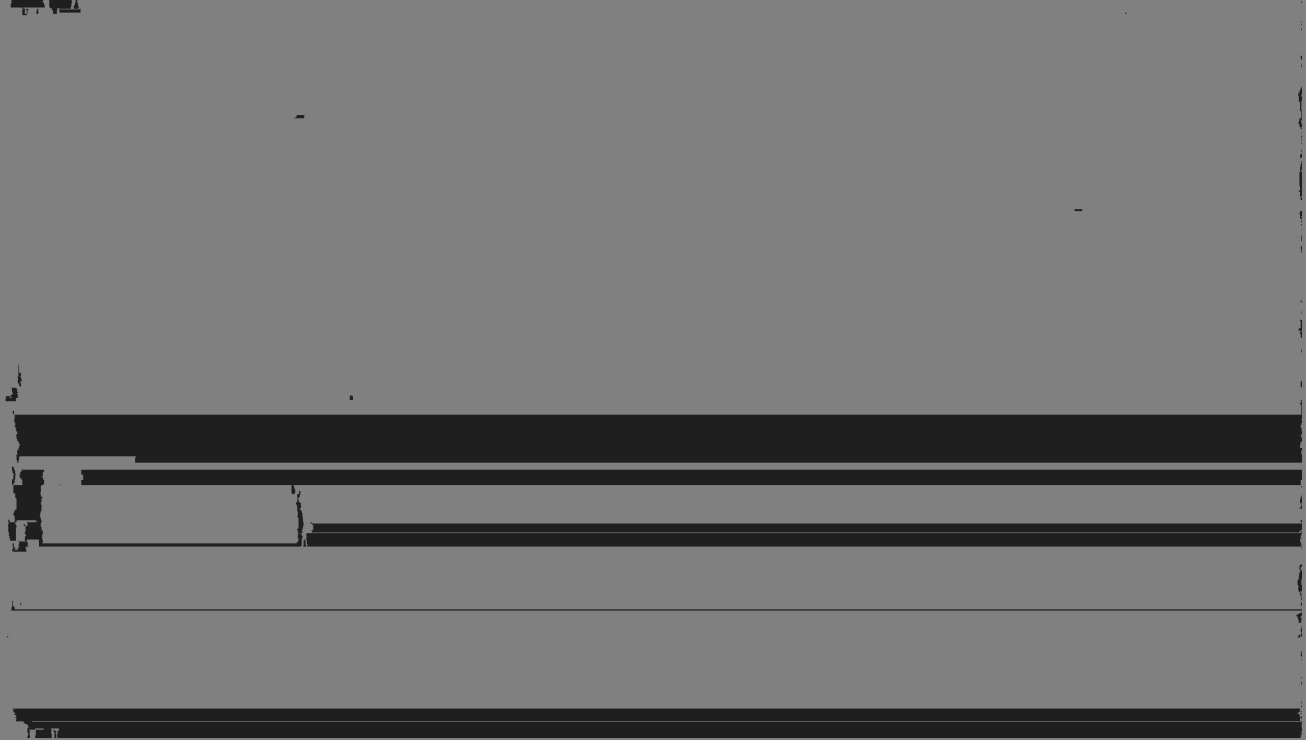

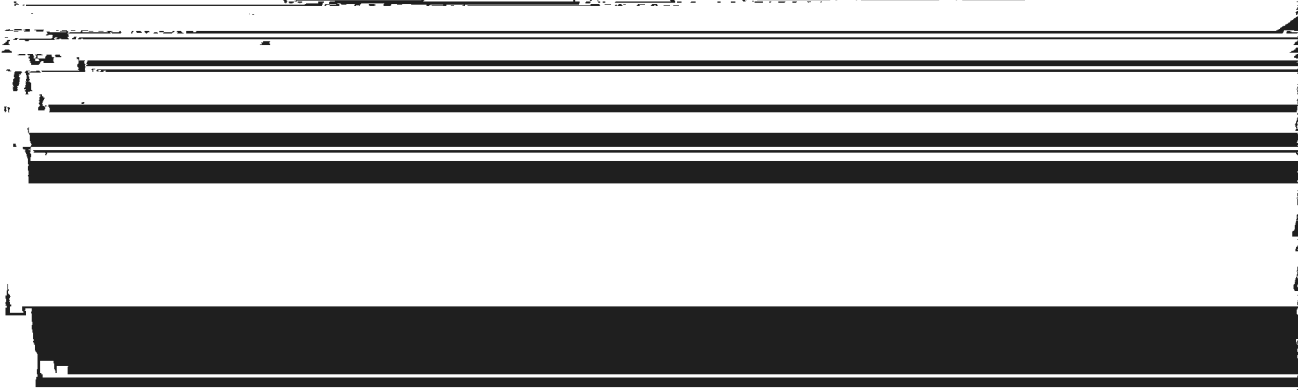

Comment Board members, please remember the superintends presentation to the districts administration and letter to the district that we must all do our part to fight against systemic racism and social injustice. He said this in response to the George

Floyd murder and the report on Black student outcomes in our district and it posting state wide. You are the system that everyone looks at. 2018-19 year, this board cut in half its Child Development program that served the most needy students in the district. Student that are enrolled because they are BELOW the national poverty guideline and are 0-5 age group. This department was recognized by the Federal reviewers the year before you dismantled it. This department served 2147 children who would in turn enter this district and were prepared to go to our district schools and succeed because of their early head start. You decided to cut the program to 1108 children, leaving 1039 SCUSD children without opportunity to preschool and receive comprehensive services. Who is serving these families? We would like to meet with you to discuss this social injustice and act of systemic racism that has occurred here and see how we can correct this ugly and shameful act.
