Mr. Borsos claims that the District has refused to negotiate with SCTA over effects of the distance learning plan. This is not true. In the Disttleva April 9, 2020 letter notifying SCTA that we would begin implementing the District knopped rectploir rep on April 13, 2020, we specifically stated:

providing basic technical support to *their* students. Finally, the District reserved the right to take legal action as necessary, but did not threaten to take that legal action against staff members.

7. Direct dealing with staff by directly negotiating with staff regarding wages and working conditions.

SCTA has not provided any details in support of this action.
