Haven Resolution, protocols developed in partnership with the Sacramento City Teachers Association, and the initial drafting of a Board Policy based on sample policy language offered by the American Civil Liberties Union; and

The Sacramento City Unified School Board recognizes the expertise and importance of engaging community advocacy groups and partners to develop robust localized policies that best benefit our students, families and staff.

the Sacramento City Unified School District, in collaboration with community groups and partners, will focus on the aforementioned policy areas between now and the end of June 2018 in order to strengthen and grow Safe Haven projections for students, families and staff;

the Sacramento City Unified School Board calls upon community leaders, local advocacy groups, and partners to engage in monthly policy development dialog around the district's Safe Haven efforts in order to develop thoughtful and impactful policies that will build upon the Safe Haven work previously completed; and

that the Policy Committee of the Sacramento City Unified School Board will host monthly meetings where advocacy groups and partners are invited to help steer the direction of future Safe Haven policy within the district.
